Based on your feedback at the last site directors meeting, we have created a midblock checklist form for you to use when you meet the students at midpoints. This form is electronic (accessed through qualtrics, like the BBOTs) and a link to the form will be sent to both you and the student along with the midblock reminder email. A print-out is attached for your information.

Finally, we are committed to providing the students the evaluations that the UCSF School of Medicine endorses for equitable, timely and substantive feedback of students on the clerkships. Student grades are due 30 days after the end of the clerkship block and evaluations must be completed in advance of this date so that we can compile and input the grades.

We will be <u>requiring</u> students to schedule a minimum of 1 evaluation every week. In order to make it easier for the evaluators, the students will be encouraged to send them an email with a brief synopsis of the work they did with them and include a picture.

We are also creating a standardized schedule to send out evaluation reminders in advance of the end of the clerkship. In addition to the regular, automatically-scheduled reminders that are sent by MedHub, the clerkship staff will be sending weekly reminders to anyone with incomplete evaluations, starting in Week 5 of the clerkship. In subsequent weeks, reminders will be cc'ed to the site director and Dr. Murtha, the Chair of the UCSF OB/GYN department (for the UCSF Mission Bay, Fresno and ZSFG sites).
